Written by comedian Dave Barry and writer Ridley Pearson, the book is a continuation of their book Peter and the Starcatchers, continuing the story of Peter's orphan and his recent adventures with the Starcatchers. The Starcatchers series is an epic story of a battle between good and evil, including a reimagined version of characters and situations from the classic novel by J.M. Barry Peter and Wendy. It was illustrated by artist Greg Coll. The series continues in Peter and Secret Runndon, Peter and the Sword of Mercy, and the bridge never land. Hyperion has also released a series of short chapter books by the same authors, detailing the daily misadventures of the Lost Boys. The plot of the summary book begins three months after the end of Peter and the Starcatchers. Peter, James, Thomas, Prentiss and Tubby Ted have settled on the island, and Tinker Bell keeps a close eye on Peter and the Pirates led by the Black Stash (who now passes by lies Captain Hook from the moment of his initial battle with Peter), erected and settled in the fort. Around the same time, Le Phantome, under the scars of Captain Nerezza, finds mollusk island after weeks of searching, accompanied by a vengeful Slate and a dark, formidable, mysterious entity known as Lord Ombré. During the confrontation with Hook, when Peter and the mermaids rescue the captured James, the detachment from Le Fantome will hold a night confrontation with the mollusk tribe because of the location of a large number of Star Time, which was briefly on the island. After Ombré makes it that Starstuff was taken by Lord Astaire and the Starcatchers, the group leaves the island and immediately goes to England. Peter, seeing the confrontation, decides that he must warn Molly about the impending danger and lays on the ship with Tinker Bell. The Asters receive a tip from the dolphins warning them of an amphibious party on Mollusk Island and the presence of the inhuman Ombré, prompting Leonard Asten to leave London with Starstuff and guard him in a hidden place until returning (the star star will be sent back to heaven), leaving new night people to guard Molly and her mother Louise. Meanwhile, Peter's presence on the ship is revealed by Lord Ombré, forcing Peter to fake his death by temporarily jumping on the ship before flying back on board. When they arrive in London, Peter and Tinker Bell take off to find the mansion Astaire, but quickly get lost in the city. Peter and Tink are later captured and separated by a constable and a bird seller, respectively, but Tink can escape and save Peter from the court hearing. They continue to search the mansion Astaire in the upper classes of London. Meanwhile, Slank, Nerezza, and Ombré plan with various agents of others on how to safely invade the Aster household, whereas Ombré possesses new nightmen so that they would not be a problem. After discovering the gnawing remnants of food on the ship and hearing about Peter's escape from the court, flying, Slank concludes that Peter is in London and believes that he will interfere with their plans. Later, the men break into the house to capture Molly and Louise. Jenna, a maid who is in cahoots with the group, puts the home staff to sleep and threatens Molly in her room with a knife while Slank and various others kidnap Louise and Ombré making their way into Molly's room. With instructions from J. M. Barry, Peter arrives and finds Molly, who realizes that Ombré has her victims touching their shadows and blowing out the candles. They barely escape from the Ombré and take refuge in the room of Molly's friend George Darling and decide to find Leonard Astaire. Peter and Molly later make a late-night visit to the Tower of London, where the secret Starcatchers complex is located. After a fight with Starcatcher Mr. McGinn about the situation, Ombré, Slank, and various others break in, killing McGinn, but Molly and Peter manage to escape, help from George, they conclude that Astaire went to Salisbury and there they will take the train and eventually find him there. Astaire expresses his disdain on arrival, but learns of the situation and the obvious ransom for Louise from Molly, but restricts them to the house after revealing that the return was to occur that night. Molly later recalls that Ombré touched McGinn's shadow before his death, realizing that Ombré may have captured the knowledge of The Return and that she was in danger. After putting George in the Starcatchers business, George recalls that the lunar eclipse was happening that night, and that the Return site was Stonehedge. Three run away from home and fly to Stonehenge. Meanwhile, Astaire and other Starcatchers Magill were ambushed in the middle of the return of Ombré, Slank, Nerezza, and various agents of others. Astaire is shot after closing the Starstuff box to protect the obsessed Louise, and Slate nearly kills Peter. Molly and George pull out the Asters, while Tink, Magill and Bear Magilla Karl drive away from the men. Peter is left behind to reopen the closed box before the timeframe for the return ends, but Ombré gathers with Peter's shadow and both engage in a brief but intense mental battle before Peter manages to open the box, thereby completing the Return of the Star Cape to Heaven, with the resulting flash of light seemingly disintegrating Ombré and releasing Louise and others out of his control. Slank and others are forced to flee. A couple of days later, Peter says goodbye to Astares and George before returning to Mollusk Island. During a plot in London, Captain Hook and the pirates manage to find and capture James, Thomas, Prentis and Tubby Ted to lure Peter back and take revenge. After a while, with the unconscious help of Smeé's first mate and various island monkeys, the boys manage to escape from the cage that they were positioned in just as Peter arrives and opens the gate of the fort for them to get out, and then quickly hits the hook in the face with the mango, finishing the book. Characters Many characters from Peter and Starcatchers are back for this sequel. However, several characters are also mentioned in Peter Pan and Wendy, and some were created exclusively for Peter and the Shadow Thieves. Peter got a constant ability to fly and never physically age because of his starlight exposure. Peter has red hair. Growing brash from his new abilities, he torments Captain Hook. When Hook captures one of Peter's friends, James, Peter vows to become more mature. So when he learns that his girlfriend Molly will be in danger because Lord Ombré will use her to exchange starstuff, stating that fathers have soft spots for their daughters, he immediately sets out to save her. He's more than a little concerned that she has a male friend named George Darling. Peter is accompanied in his adventures by his guardian Tinker Bell, a fairy or a bird that is very protective of Peter. Tinker Bell was originally a green-yellow-colored bird put in a starstuff bag and was taken in the guardianship by Peter's father Molly, the famous starcatcher. Lord Leonard Astaire. She hates being called a fairy because she would rather be called a bird because she supports her legacy. She is very protective of Peter, she eminently dislikes when Peter pays attention to any other woman she calls a mermaid, a teacher, a big fat grouper, usually hoping that she gets eaten by an octopus, and Molly Astaire as a stupid fat cow. It is able to emit a very bright light. This helps Peter many times against Lord Ombré, although this technique often ends in her exhaustion and sometimes fainting. Molly Astaire, daughter of the great Starcatcher Leonard Astaire, is very much like her mother, with long brown hair but inherited her father's striking green eyes. London society views her as a beautiful child, but also unusual, seeing how she is not interested in the things the girls her class in, and it seems her mind is always thinking about something else. When her father leaves to move a large number of stars to safety, she is left behind as a company for her mother. Soon Molly learns that her house is invaded by spies, and that the creature Lord Ombré wants to steal the shadows of his family. Molly goes with Peter to continue to protect the star, even at the cost of his mother's life. Molly lives in a mansion near Kensington Gardens and is a childhood friend of George Darling. They both have feelings for each other, as hinted at in this book, and do not know how or whether to express their feelings. You might insinuating that she also has feelings for Peter. The Lost Boys were originally orphaned from St Norbert's home for the Wayward Boys. James is the leader of Thomas, Prentiss and Tubby Ted when Peter is not around. The Lost Boys discover their underground home in this book - they are also captured and almost killed by Captain Hook, but they manage to escape. Captain Hook, former Black Stas, disgusting, dirty pirate, ship captain, Jolly Roger. Slank is one of the others who use starstuff corruptly, and he has joined forces with the creature Lord Ombré to avenge his humiliation of Peter. In Starcatchers, Slank had an assistant named Little Richard. Slank had to kill Richard and eat him to survive for months in a stream of rowing boats. His fate is unknown after a meeting with Starkchers. Lord Ombré is the new villain in this and Peter's sworn enemy. It is part of the part of the shadow, and it moves like liquid. He causes a chill to come upon whomever he approaches because he is able to steal their shadow or possess them to read their thoughts and enslave them. Ombré is afraid of light, but it helps him in capturing shadows. He is one of the great Others. Lord Ombré is destroyed by a brilliant flash of light that breaks him into millions of tiny shadows. Leonard himself is shot in Shadow Thieves, but Peter heals him with a bit of starstuff. Louise Astaire is Molly's mother, who stays with her daughter when her husband leaves to take care of the star. Lady Astaire's shadow is stolen by Lord Ombré, and her body, which looks like a corpse, is used to lure Molly out of hiding. Louise Astaire's shadow returns to the end of the novel. Mr. Magill is a Stark Thatcher who owns tamed wolves and a domesticated bear. He can communicate with them and uses them to protect the home that Starcatcher has. It also helps keep the Others away until Peter completes the comeback. He also returns to the Sword of Mercy and is mentioned in the Bridge of Never Land. J.M. Barry - a good young man who saves Peter from being beaten by a gang of hooligans in London. In Bridge to Never Land, it was revealed that Barry had written his Peter Pan stories as part of the universe series, suggesting that he had somehow had contact with Starkchers and learned a semi-accurate version of the truth, but details of how it happened are not considered.
